School's Verification Policy

To ensure fairness in final course grades, the School of Law uses an anonymous grading system. In those courses which are graded anonymously (clinical courses and seminars are generally the only exception), students must place only their exam number on the exam or course paper. This reflects the Faculty policy that grading is to be objectively performed; students are therefore also cautioned against writing anything in exams or course papers that is extrinsic to the subject matter of the course, that might develop instructor sympathy, or that has behind it other non-objective motives. Sometimes anonymity must be broken for some component of the course as when students are allowed to review their midterm exams with the instructor, or the instructor assigns a paper which cannot be graded anonymously, for a portion of the grade. In such instances, the Records Office then combines the anonymous and non-anonymous scores into one final gradep>
